LEARNER SUPPORT



Our Learner Support Team provides pastoral care, advice and support for our learners. The team also offer support regarding specific learning difficulties and health issues. On occasions, our learners may need specialist support for issues such as mental health and the team will identify and signpost learners to the appropriate qualified professionals. Alongside our dedicated Learner Support Team, our training staff have a wealth of experience in supporting our learners, from day to day workplace issues to more serious problems.

The team identify if any of our learners have any special educational needs or health issues which may impact on their learning. We gather this information as soon as the apprenticeship commences which enables us to create a plan to provide the necessary support required during their training. If required, we can also arrange for any additional support such as extra time during exams or accessing specific IT packages which may benefit learners when writing assignments or reports.
